SECTION 2: HAZARDS IDENTIFICATION

2.1. Classification of the substance or mixture

In compliance with EC regulation No. 1272/2008 and its amendments.

The mixture satisfies neither the PBT nor the vPvB criteria for mixtures in accordance with annexe XIII of the REACH regulations EC 1907/2006. In case of sanding of the dry film, the method can generate cellular silica particles. We recommend the wearing of appropriate respiratory protection (type P3) due to the hazardous nature of respirable crystalline silica.

SECTION 4: FIRST AID MEASURES

4.1. Description of first aid measures

In the event of exposure by inhalation:

Remove to fresh air, keep the person warm and at rest. If breathing has stopped, effect mouth-to-mouth resuscitation. Give nothing by mouth. If the person is unconscious, place in recovery position and call a doctor

In the event of splashes or contact with eyes :

Wash thoroughly with soft, clean water for 15 minutes holding the eyelids open.

If there is any redness, pain or visual impairment, consult an ophthalmologist.

In the event of splashes or contact with skin:

Watch out for any remaining product between skin and clothing, watches, shoes, etc.

Remove contaminated clothing

Wash skin thoroughly with water

Do not use solvents or thinners

In the event of swallowing:

Seek medical attention, showing the label.

Keep at rest. Do not induce vomiting

SECTION 5: FIREFIGHTING MEASURES

Non-flammable.

5.1. Extinguishing media

Suitable methods of extinction

5.2. Special hazards arising from the substance or mixture

A fire will often produce a thick black smoke. Exposure to decomposition products may be hazardous to health.

tha product contains plaster which can be decomposed into lime and sulfuric anhydride at temperatures above 1200°C.

5.3. Advice for firefighters

Use self-contained breathing apparatus and protective clothing

Prevent effluent from entering sewers or waterways

Cool in closed containers exposed to fire.

SECTION 6: ACCIDENTAL RELEASE MEASURES

6.1. Personal precautions, protective equipment and emergency procedures

Ensure adequate ventilation

In case of dust formation use a respirator with filter type P3.

Avoid contact with skin and eyes

For first aid worker

First aid workers will be equipped with suitable personal protective equipment (See section 8).

6.2. Environmental precautions

Prevent any material from entering drains or waterways.

If the product contaminates lakes, rivers or sewage, inform appropriate authorities in accordance with statutory procedures.

6.3. Methods and material for containment and cleaning up

Retrieve the product by mechanical means (sweeping/vacuuming): do not generate dust.

SECTION 7: HANDLING AND STORAGE

Requirements relating to storage premises apply to all facilities where the mixture is handled.

Anyone suffering from respiratory problems or allergies must not handle or be exposed to powdered paints

7.1. Precautions for safe handling

Always wash hands after handling.

Use in a well ventilated area

Avoid contact with skin and eyes.

Avoid the flights of dust during the mixing of the product.

Fire prevention:

Precautions must be taken to prevent any dust formation at a concentration higher than ignition or explosion concentration or the occupational exposure limits.

Use the mixture in premises free of naked flames or other sources of ignition and ensure that electrical equipment is suitably protected.

Keep packages tightly closed and away from sources of heat, sparks and naked flames.

Prevent access by unauthorised personnel.

Recommended equipment and procedures :

Observe precautions stated on label and also industrial safety regulations.

Packages which have been opened must be reclosed carefully and stored in an upright position.

Wear respiratory protection in case of insufficient ventilation (mask type P3).
